Canadian artist Daniel Powter seems to have been born with melodies pouring out of his soul. Performing music since he was a child, he gradually focused on learning to write songs. He quickly found that music was his true passion, realising that it was the only thing he wanted to do. Throughout his youth, Daniel wrote and performed his songs to family, friends and anyone who would listen. Then, on a random ferry ride from Victoria to Vancouver it happened. He wrote a song that comes along rarely, like the total eclipse of the sun - A song that was instantly relatable to everyone who heard it, with a melody that once heard was never forgotten, and it continues to touch fans all over the world. That song was "Bad Day", Daniel Powter's first single on Warner Bros. Records.

> In the spring of 2023, Daniel recorded and co-produced an EDM version of "Bad Day" with a top European EDM producer and DJ. The song was released in the summer of 2023 and achieved instant massive success, showing that Daniel's talent is recognised across many musical genres. In fact, the song, as of August 2024 remains his #3 streaming song across his entire catalog. In early 2024 Daniel stunned Canadian audiences by performing a new rendition of "Bad Day" as a surprise, unannounced quest on the #1 Canadian show "Canada's Got Talent", creating a viral sensation.

> > Daniel is currently completing recording several new singles for his forthcoming album release scheduled for early 2025, one of which has already been identified as a possible theme for the 2028 Olympics in Los Angeles. We are preparing for a worldwide tour that will coincide with the new album release, which likely will commence in SE Asia after the Chinese New Year.
