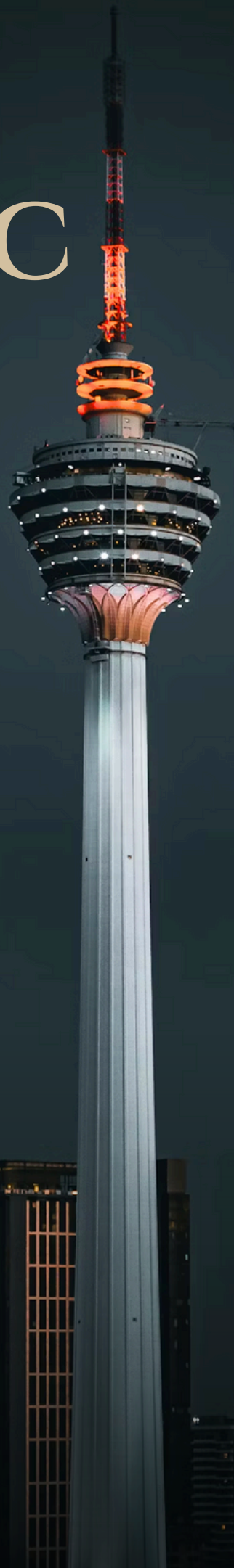


# THE ICONIC LAND MARK
