

THE EVERGREEN ACTRESS (HONG KONG)



Rebecca Chan Sau Chu, born on October 20, 1958, in Hong Kong, is a renowned Hong Kong actress. She hails from Chaozhou, Guangdong. In 1979, she participated in the Miss Hong Kong pageant, which led to her signing a contract with Hong Kong Television Broadcasts Limited (TVB) as a contracted artist.

During the 1980s, she was one of TVB's leading actresses and appeared in more than 80 television drama series. She also ventured into film, portraying memorable roles that captivated audiences. Additionally, she was involved in numerous commercial advertisements, showcasing her versatility in portraying various characters and personalities.

In later years, she transitioned to work under a management contract with TVB until the conclusion of her contract in 2021. In 2023, she joined True Star, a talent agency led by the artiste Ma Chun Wai, with whom she shares common ideals.

Throughout her career, Rebecca Chan has achieved notable recognition. In 1982, she received the "Hong Kong Youth Artist Award" at the Manila International Film Festival. In 2005, she was honoured with the "Evergreen Artist Award" at the "Next TV Awards" in Hong Kong.



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During her childhood, Rebecca Chan was a competitive child who sought equality in all matters and even felt envious when her classmates had new school bags. Prior to entering the entertainment industry, she worked as ground staff at Cathay Pacific Airways from 1977 to 1979. Her aversion to diving prevented her from pursuing a career as a flight attendant. Subsequently, from 1979 to 1980, she served as a customer service supervisor at Philippine Airlines.

In the early 1990s, Rebecca Chan briefly engaged in business in Malaysia, where she opened a Sichuan-style fast-food restaurant. However, due to the resignation of the chef and her own inadequate management skills, she was forced to close the business.



In 2017, during an interview, Rebecca Chan revealed that she had been shuttling between Hong Kong and the United States for many years to take care of her son, Chan Di Ga. She explained that she has a fondness for the Chinese character "迪" (Ti) and named her son "迪加" (Ti Ga) because he was born in California in 1999. Upon returning to Hong Kong from the U.S., she discovered that her son's name coincided with the name of a Japanese Tokusatsu superhero, Ultraman Tiga. As her son reached adulthood, she cherished the time spent with him and admitted to occasionally pretending to be tired, solely to be closer to him.
