

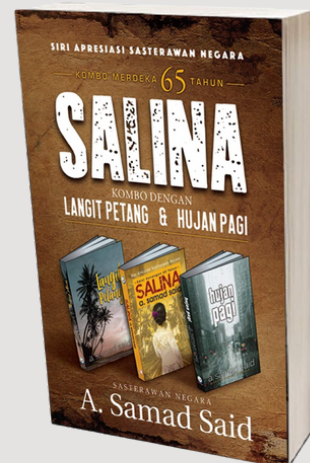


YANG BERBAHAGIA SASTERAWAN NEGARA DATO' SERI A. SAMAD SAID

WHILE EMPHASIZING THE VALUE OF LITERATURE, SAMAD ALSO RECOGNIZES THE IMPORTANCE OF ART FOR SOCIETY. HE SUCCESSFULLY COMBINES LITERARY RESPONSIBILITIES WITH NECESSARY SOCIETAL VALUES. HIS APPROACH BRIDGES THE GAP BETWEEN WRITERS OF THE ASAS 50 GENERATION, WHO FOCUSED ON THEMES AND MESSAGES, AND SUBSEQUENT GENERATIONS THAT EMPHASIZED THE VALUES WITHIN LITERATURE.

Samad's achievements have garnered recognition from the government and literary community. He has been honored as a "Pejuang Sastera" (Literary Fighter) alongside other notable authors. He has also been appointed as a member of prestigious panels, including the Literary Awards panel. Samad's significant contributions to Malay literature were further acknowledged when he received the Southeast Asian Writers Award (S.E.A. Write Awards) and was eventually bestowed the title of National Laureate in 1985. His impact as a literary figure was showcased through his works, including his acclaimed drama "Wira Bukit."
